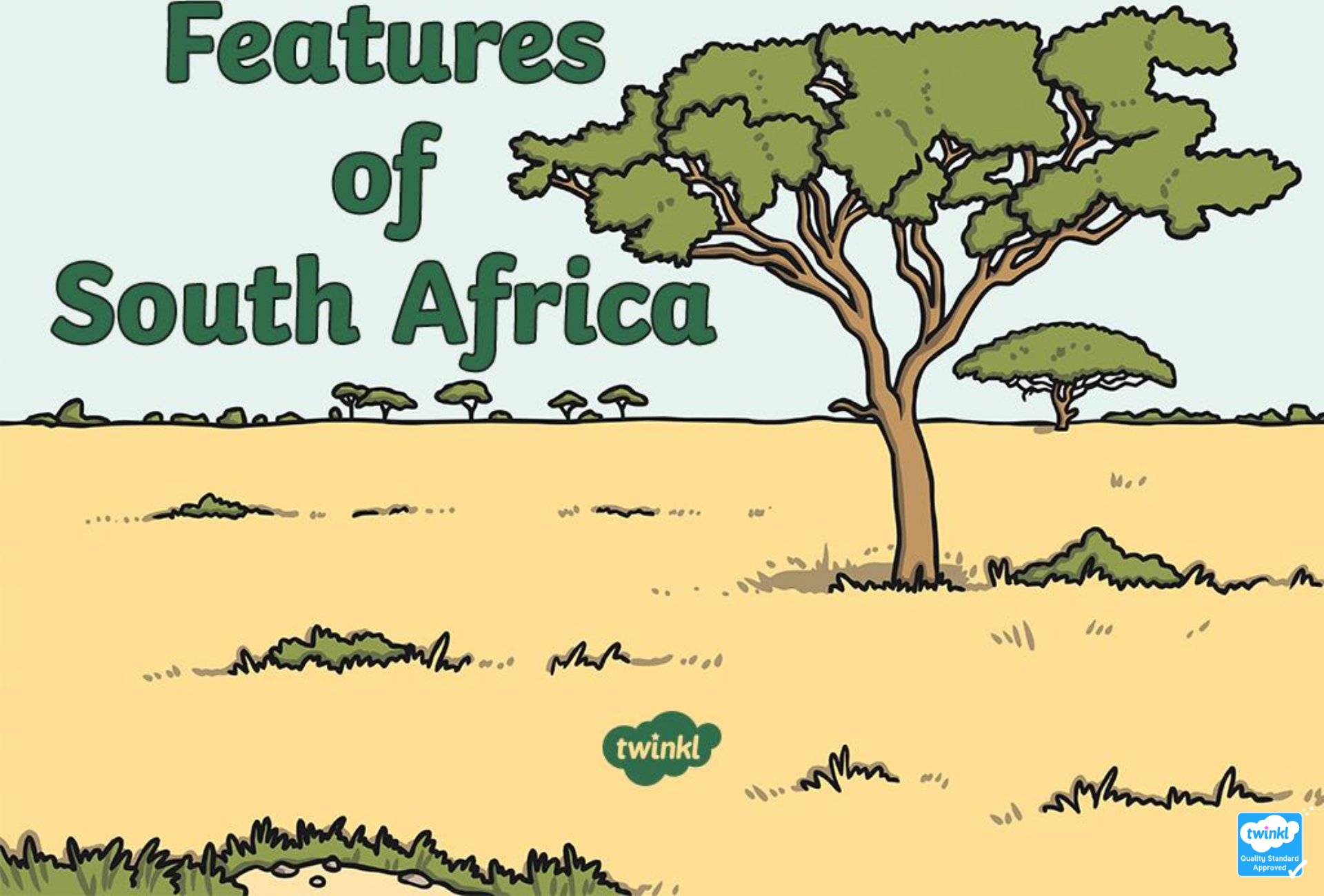


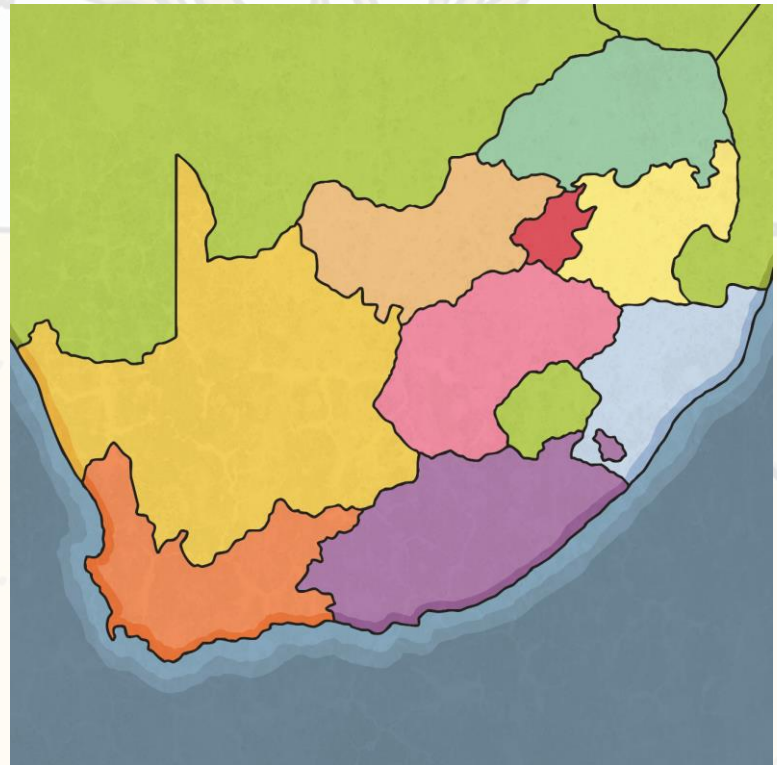

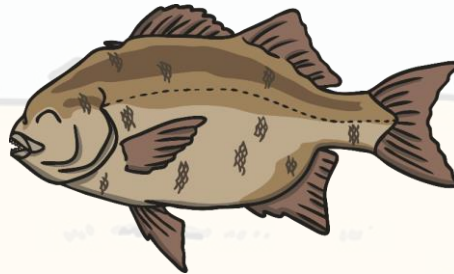

But many people use informal mini buses to get to and from work.

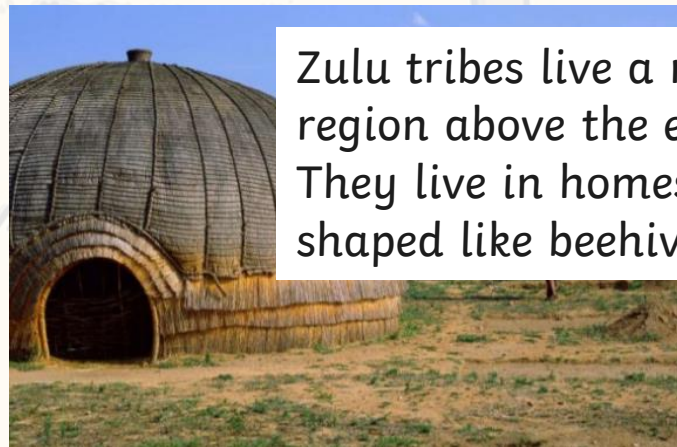
Traditional ways to transport goods and to get to and from the village was by foot but people began to use horses and carts.

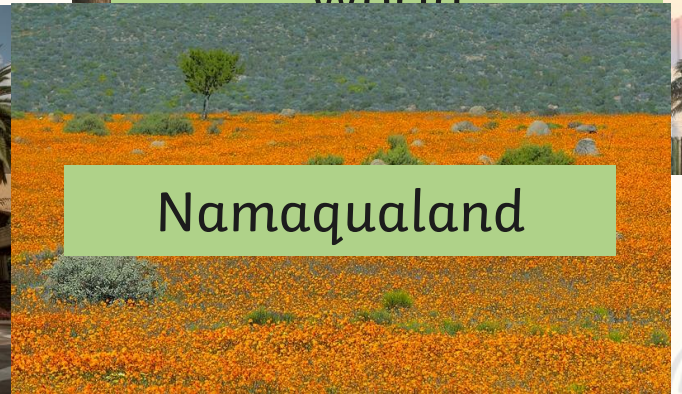
