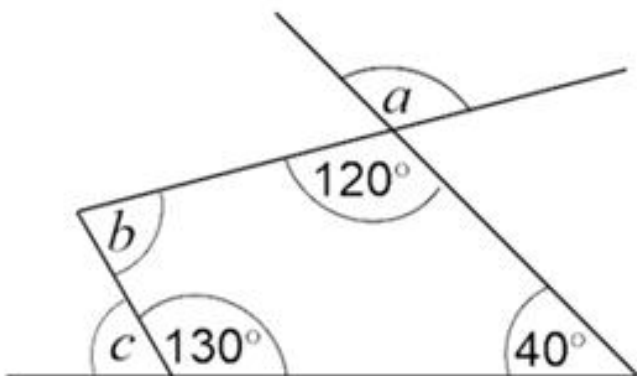

### **Should we ban Christmas Traditions?**

Enjoyed by all, Turkey is the meat that everyone wants to eat in December time. It is the meat that is being over sold in most restaurants and supermarkets due to its popularity. Everyone is desperate for it to be on their shiny platter in the middle of their decorated table on December 25<sup>th</sup>. Some also say that Turkeys are a 'Christmas bird' and therefore need to still be used in the right way at this time of year.

Having considered both sides of the argument, there are several reasons as to why turkeys should and should not be allowed to be involved with the Christmas traditions. Letter WAGOLL for Friday's big write  
To Farmer

This Christmas would you not consider forgoing the deceased bird? In today's farming system, beautiful, inquisitive, intelligent turkeys endure lives of suffering and painful deaths. Bellow you will find reasons to carve out a new tradition by flocking to vegan entrées-and thankfully, none of them require stuffing anyone.

First of all, you must considered that Turkeys are "smart animals with personality and character, and keen awareness of their surroundings," says Oregon State University poultry scientist Tom Savage. Research has shown that when an individual turkey is removed from his flock, even in domesticity, he will squawk in obvious protest until reunited with his posse. Astonishingly, they relish having their feathers stroked and will even dance when reunited with a person they recognise. Anyone who spends time with them at farm sanctuaries quickly learns that turkeys are as varied in personality as dogs and cats.

Another positive reason why you should not eat Turkeys for and opt for alternative comes from a study in the Nutrition Reviews journal which reports that "a low-fat vegan diet leads to weight loss of about 1 pound per week, even without additional exercise or limits on portion sizes, calories, or carbohydrates." Dr Neal Barnard (one of the studies authors) highlights the evidence that a vegan diet causes an increased calorie burn after meals, meaning plant-based foods are being used more efficiently as fuel for the body, as opposed to being stored as fat. Take the cruelty off your plate and look great? Sounds like a win-win situation.

Therefore, give up the giblets and carve out a new tradition this Christmas.. We suggest cooking a Tofurky Roast, a savory soy- and wheat-based roast with stuffing and gravy, or one of the plethora of roasts and "meat-free" loaves that Field Roast has to offer.

Finally, I hope you considered the points I have made and think carefully about your choice in Christmas dinner; give animals and yourself something to be really merry about this year. We wish you a merry Christmas and a happy new year.
